PURPOSE

The purpose of the Scholarship Program at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo (UH Hilo) is to recognize and reward students who have demonstrated outstanding academic performance and to encourage those students who show academic potential and a willingness to participate in community activities. The scholarship awards imply the expectation of continued exceptional performance and leadership by the recipients in the years ahead.

SOURCE

UH Hilo scholarship funds come from various sources such as private donors, foundations, professional associations, state and local business firms.

SPECIFIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Those classified (in a degree program) who are enrolled or plan to enroll as full time students at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo may apply for the following scholarships:

- **Regents Scholarships for Academic Excellence**
These highly competitive academic scholarships are awarded to 20 incoming freshman at any University of Hawai'i campus who are residents of Hawai'i. These awards, which are renewable for qualified students, consist of \$4,000, a tuition waiver, and a one-time travel grant. Contact Ginger Hamilton for an application at SSB 202. Deadline February 1.
- **Presidential Scholarships**
These highly competitive academic scholarships are awarded to ten college juniors who are residents of Hawai'i and enrolled at the Manoa, Hilo or West Oahu campuses of the University. These awards, which are renewable for qualified seniors, consist of \$4,000, a tuition waiver, and a one-time travel grant. Contact Ginger Hamilton for an application at 974-7451. Deadline February 1.
- **Chancellor's Scholarship**
These highly competitive academic scholarships are awarded to approximately 18 incoming freshmen who are graduates of Hawai'i public high schools.

This award, which is available for four years for qualified students, consists of an annual tuition waiver. Recipients will be invited and encouraged to participate in honors courses, leadership activities, and community service. Contact the Admissions Office for an application.

- **Centennial Scholarship**
Centennial Scholarship of up to \$1,000 are available to Hawai'i residents who graduated from a Hawai'i high school after 2006 who have a 3.8 high school gpa or scored a 1800 or higher on the SAT (27on the ACT). Contact the Admissions Office for additional information.
- **Barney S. Fujimoto Memorial Scholarship**
Six or more \$1000 awards given annually through Big Island high schools to graduating high school seniors with financial need. Contact your high school counselor for an application.
- **Audrey Furukawa Study Abroad Scholarship**
This scholarship will assist students pursuing an opportunity to study abroad. Recipients must have a minimum 3.2 GPA and be accepted into an approved study abroad program. Interested students should contact the Center for Global Education and Exchange. The number and amount of scholarships will be based on the availability of funds.
- **College of Arts and Sciences Business Administration Rising Senior Achievement Award**
A one-year tuition waiver given by the Business and Economics faculty in September to the senior who earned the highest GPA in his/her previous years in the College of Arts and Sciences (minimum GPA required). No application necessary.
- **Hawai'i Island Chamber of Commerce Scholarship**
\$2000 scholarship (\$1000 payable each semester) awarded annually to UH Hilo students with declared majors in Business Administration and/or Economics for use in their junior or senior year. Contact Dr. Jeffrey Decker or the Financial Aid Office for an application.

- **Daniel G. Fox Prize for Excellence in Computer Science**

Daniel G. Fox was a UH Hilo Computer Science major who would have graduated in December, 1990. In his memory, the \$500 Daniel G. Fox Prize for Excellence in Computer Science is awarded each year to the incoming Computer Science senior who demonstrates the greatest academic achievement. Applications begin by writing a letter to the Computer Science department requesting consideration and setting forth anything which the applicant considers appropriate in support of the application.

The annual application deadline is March 1.

- **Frederic Duclos Barstow Scholarship**

Scholarships for full-time undergraduate students of American Samoan ancestry who are pursuing a degree that requires math and/or a science major. Students must be entering their 2nd, 3rd, or 4th year at UH Hilo. Recipients must have financial need and at least a 2.0 GPA. The number and amount of the scholarships will be based on the availability of funds.

- **Ruth E. Black Scholarship**

Scholarships of \$200 or more awarded to students who demonstrate the potential for academic growth and achievement. First priority for scholarships shall be given to the sons and daughters of engineers, contractors and construction workers. Second priority shall be given to students pursuing construction-related fields of study: engineering, pre-engineering, architecture, drafting, carpentry, construction trades, etc. Third priority shall be given to all other well-qualified students. Minimum 3.0 GPA.

- **Boeing UHH Scholarship**

Scholarships ranging from \$2000 to \$3000 are awarded annually to students enrolled full-time in Astronomy, Computer Science and Business Administration. Financial need as determined by FAFSA guidelines.

- **Larry Child Scholarship**

\$1,500 or more awarded annually. Recipients must be Hawai'i residents. Four-year renewable scholarship but must apply each year.

- **Paul Mark Clark/Carl Moon Scholarship**

Scholarship provided to full-time students majoring in the Performing Arts. Students must have financial need and minimum 3.20 GPA. The number and amount of the scholarships will be based on availability of funds.

- **Criminal Justice Scholarship**

Annual awards (amount of awards dependent on income from investments) for Hawai'i State resident students interested in making community service contributions on the Island of Hawai'i to needy individuals or charitable organizations or agencies that serve the needy.

- **Alec and Kay Keith Scholarship**

Recipients must have graduated from a Hawai'i high school (with preference given to Big Island high schools) or be citizens of the U.S. affiliated Pacific Island States, have financial need, and demonstrate academic merit. Incoming freshman should have a minimum 3.00 high school GPA. Continuing and transfer students should have a minimum 2.70 college GPA. To be considered, complete the FAFSA by March 1.

- **Faliuwseuw Endowed Scholarship**

This scholarship provides support to students from Fais Island, Yap State in the Federated States of Micronesia. Recipients must be full-time citizens of the Federated States of Micronesia who have been born and raised on Fais Island. Students must have financial need and a minimum 2.5 GPA. The amount of the scholarships will be based on the availability of funds.

- **James W. & Eleanor B. Frierson Endowed Scholarship Fund**

Enroll either full-time or part-time. A written statement on student's background and how an English major or concentration will help to fulfill his/her career aspirations. Some degree of financial need. Preference will be given to students who come from a disadvantaged background.

- **Hawai'i Educational Opportunity Fund**

One or more scholarships awarded annually to full- or part-time undergraduate students, with preference given to residents of the Big Island. Recipients must have a minimum GPA of 2.7 and some degree of financial need.

- **Hawai'i Florists & Shippers Association Endowed Scholarship Fund**

Hawai'i residents enrolled full-time with the College of Agriculture, Forestry and Natural Resource Management with an emphasis in floriculture and/or ornamental production. Minimum 3.0 GPA required with some degree of financial need. First year students are not eligible to apply.

- **Hawai'i Veteran's Memorial Fund**
\$350 or more scholarships awarded annually to UH Hilo students with minimum cumulative GPAs of 2.5 for Freshman/Sophomore and 2.75 for Juniors/Seniors. Must be a Hawai'i resident. Renewable but must apply annually.
- **Charles R. Hemenway Scholarship**
Scholarships ranging from \$200 to \$2000 are awarded each year. Recipients must be Hawai'i residents with verifiable Community/School service activities. Four-year renewable but must apply annually.
- **Hilo High School Class of 1940 Scholarship**
One or more \$750 scholarships awarded annually to a graduating senior from Hilo High School.
- **Daniel K. Inouye Scholarship in Astronomy**
This scholarship is awarded to full-time undergraduate Astronomy majors. Recipients must be seniors with a minimum 3.5 GPA. Preference will be given to graduates of a high school in the state of Hawaii. One award will be made annually in the amount of one-half the cost of tuition.
- **Frank T. Inouye Scholarship Fund**
Scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$1000 are awarded annually to students enrolled or planning to enroll in History, Political Science and Economics. Minimum 3.0 GPA and have some degree of financial need.
- **Ronald S. Jitchaku Memorial Scholarship**
Awards in the amount of annual tuition costs awarded to full-time students enrolled in the UH Hilo Liberal Studies/Administration of Justice Program. Recipients must be graduates of a high school in the State of Hawai'i. The number and amount of scholarships will be based on the availability of funds. Minimum 2.5 GPA.
- **Phyllis Kahaney Humanities Award**
\$300 awarded annually to a Humanities major, preference given to students age 27 or above and enrolled at least half-time. Recipients must demonstrate financial need and have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA.
- **Williard D. Keim Memorial Scholarship**
\$500 or more awarded annually to Political Science majors with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above.
- **Kenneth K. Keliipio Scholarship**
One \$1200 scholarship shall be awarded annually based on availability of funds to a full time student enrolled in the UHH Liberal Studies/Administration of Justice Program. Recipient must be a graduate of a high school in the state of Hawai'i. Renewable, but must apply annually. Minimum 2.5 GPA.
- **Kohala First Year Scholarship**
Up to four non-renewable scholarships awarded annually to graduates of Kohala High School who are entering UH Hilo as freshmen. Awards cover tuition and fees, book and supplies, on-campus housing and meals, and personal expenses. Recipients must have demonstrated financial need. Preference given to recipients who are first generation college students and who have a history of community service.
- **Paul J. Kopecky Memorial Scholarship**
Minimum of \$500 awarded annually to students who are active in the area of student services either through student employment, activities, as a volunteer or in some other way. Minimum 2.5 GPA.
- **Lin Hing Society Endowed Scholarship**
Enrolled in at least 9 credit hours in a liberal arts or vocational education program. Minimum GPA of 2.0, and financial need. Preference given to applicants of Chinese heritage from Hilo, the Big Island or Guandong Province, China. The number and amount of the scholarship will vary.
- **J.M. Long Foundation Scholarship**
This scholarship is available to full-time undergraduates enrolled in health or business related majors. Students must be a Hawai'i resident, have financial need and demonstrate academic merit. The number and amount of the scholarship will be based on the availability of funds.
- **Robert Marx Scholarship in Nursing**
Recipients must be enrolled full-time as a junior or senior in the UH Hilo Nursing Program. Students must have financial need and a minimum 3.2 GPA. The number and amount of the scholarships will be based on the availability of funds.
- **Constance E. Masutani Memorial Scholarship**
Scholarship of \$400 or more awarded annually to graduates of Big Island High Schools. Preference given to entering freshmen who graduated from Hilo High School.
- **George M. Matsumura Memorial Scholarship**
Two or more \$200 scholarships awarded annually to part-time or full-time employees of KTA Super Stores who enroll or plan to enroll in the business field (with an emphasis in accounting). Minimum 2.5 GPA and financial need.
- **NHERC Scholarship**
The Scholarship is for either full-time or part-time undergraduates enrolled at the North Hawaii Education Research Center (NHERC). Recipients must have financial need. Preference will be given to residents of Hamakua and Kohala. The number and amount of the scholarships will be based on the availability of funds.

- Osher Reentry Scholarship**
This fund provides scholarships to assist reentry students between the ages of 25-50 whose collegiate studies have been interrupted by circumstances beyond their control for at least five years and are resuming their studies to complete their first undergraduate baccalaureate degree. Recipients must also have financial need. Students must anticipate participation in the workforce for a significant period of time subsequent to graduation. The number and amount of the scholarships will be based on the availability of funds.
- Sharon Peterson Scholarship**
Annual scholarship of \$1,000 awarded to a student enrolled full-time in the Teacher Education Program. Preference will be given to a student who has a record of volunteer service as an inspirational coach or teacher.
- UH Hilo Pride Legacy Scholarship**
Recipients must be active members of Pride Hilo a UH Hilo Registered Independent Student Organization. Undergraduate students must have completed at least 24 credit hours. Graduate students may also apply. Students must have financial need and a minimum 3.0 GPA. One \$500 scholarship will be awarded annually.
- Rotary Club of Hilo Scholarship Fund**
Scholarship of \$1,500 awarded annually to full-time student enrolled in the College of Business and Economics. Minimum 2.5 GPA. Some degree of financial need. Demonstrate volunteer service in the community.
- Sangam Scholarship**
One or more scholarships awarded annually. Recipients must have a minimum 3.0 GPA, demonstrate financial need and be a graduate of a Hawai'i high school and/or a resident of Hawai'i for at least five years.
- Hiroo Sato Scholarship**
Scholarships up to \$1,000 awarded to students with financial need. Minimum 3.0 GPA for entering students, and 2.7 GPA for continuing students.
- Marie E. Schleichert Annual College of Agriculture Scholarship**
\$100 scholarships awarded annually to College of Agriculture students. Recipients must be a resident of the Island of Hawai'i and have a desire to work in forestry or some phase of agriculture or aquaculture, with an intent to save the land and seas in and around Hawai'i. (Horticulture is excluded.) Preference given to applicants of Hawaiian Ancestry or Native Americans.
- Lawrence Silva Memorial Scholarship**
Recipients must be enrolled full-time as an undergraduate or graduate student in the Ka Haka Ula Ke'elikelani College of Hawaiian Language. Recipients may also include post-baccalaureate students in the Kahuawaiola Indigenous Teacher Education Program. Students must have financial need and at least a 3.0 GPA. The number and amount of scholarships will be based on the availability of funds.
- G.Y. Sonomura Scholarship**
Full tuition scholarship for a single parent enrolled full time or part time in an undergraduate or graduate program in any area of study. GPA must be 3.5 or higher; some degree of financial need. Written essay required describing educational goals and answering the question "What are the greatest hurdles faced in order to attain this goal?"
- G.Y. Sonomura Scholarship for Japanese Studies**
\$500 scholarship awarded annually to Japanese Studies majors with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or better and have some degree of financial need.
- Student Opportunity Fund**
Four scholarship awards (usually around \$2000 each) for students in music, drama and painting. Recipients must be a Hawai'i high school graduate, minimum 3.0 GPA and have financial need. Priority given to students of Asian-Pacific Island ancestry.
- Richard R. Taniguchi Scholarship**
Annual awards (amount and number of awards dependent on income from investments) for full time students majoring in Business. Some degree of financial need. Recipients are eligible for scholarship renewal up to four years so long as all criteria are met.
- John & Mary Tolmie and James & Fulvia Bailey Endowed Scholarship**
Scholarships for full-time undergraduate students with financial need. Preference given to graduates of a Hawai'i high school. The number and amount of the scholarships will be based on the availability of funds.
- UH Hilo Alumni & Friends Scholarship**
Scholarships of up to \$1,500 awarded annually to full- or part-time undergraduate or graduate students who are immediate family members of UH Hilo alumni (or, in the case of graduate students, UH Hilo alumni themselves). Minimum GPA of 2.5 for undergraduates and 3.0 for graduate students. Some degree of financial need.
- UH Hilo Volunteer Service Award**
Two or more \$500 awards given annually to continuing students who have contributed outstanding volunteer, non-compensated service which significantly benefits the University and/or

community. Minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA required.

- **Dr. Francis F.C. Wong Memorial Scholarship**
Four \$750 scholarships awarded annually to Big Island high school graduates who have excelled as athletes.
- **James S. Sr. & Kameko Yagi Memorial Scholarship**
Four \$250 scholarships awarded annually to graduates of Big Island high schools. Preference will be given to entering freshman.
- **Michio Yoshimura Memorial Art Scholarship**
\$300 scholarship awarded annually to a graduate of a Big Island High School. Preference given to the graduating seniors from Waiakea and Hilo High Schools. Recipient must be admitted as an Art Major at UH Hilo. This award may be renewable but students must apply each year.

- **Beatrice Campbell Beckley/Hoowaiwai Farms Scholarship**
Scholarship(s) awarded annually to College of Agriculture students who are graduates of Big Island high schools.
- **Dr. Frederick K. T. Tom Memorial Scholarship**
\$500 scholarship awarded annually to a graduating Hawai'i Island High School senior or entering junior or entering senior in the College of Agriculture. Minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA required. Renewable, but must reapply the following year.

The following four music scholarships are incorporated into a single application which may be obtained by contacting the Performing Arts Department or the UH Hilo Financial Aid Office:

- **Gloriana Adap Memorial Scholarship for Singers**
\$100 to \$200 scholarships awarded annually to students enrolled or planning to enroll in music studies. Recipients must maintain a 2.5 in music courses, 2.0 overall, and participate in all UH Hilo choral ensemble. Interview and audition required.
- **Richard Adap Memorial Scholarship for Singers**
\$250 to \$500 scholarships awarded annually to students enrolled or planning to enroll in music studies. Recipients must maintain a GPA of 2.5 in music courses, 2.0 overall, and participate in all UH Hilo choral ensembles. Interview and audition required.

- **Paul Gouglides Memorial Grant for Pianists**
An award of an amount to be determined by the Music Scholarship Committee given to a serious piano student. Recipient must be a full-time student, maintain a GPA of 3.0 in music courses and 2.5 overall, participate in a UH Hilo music ensemble. Interview and audition required.

Annual scholarships of \$750 to \$1000 are awarded to female students attending UH Hilo. Students must be a classified student at the Junior level or above at the beginning of the academic year for which the

scholarship is awarded; be a resident of the state of Hawaii or have graduated from a high school in Hawaii; have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above; demonstrate financial need. Deadline for returning the completed application is April 1. Applications may be obtained from the UH Hilo Financial Aid Office.

- **Big Island Press Club's Robert Miller Scholarship**
Awarded annually to a Big Island student interested in the communications media. Applicants must have a desire for a career in the media. Applications available from Big Island Press Club, P.O. Box 1920, Hilo, Hawai'i 96720.
- **Big Island Association of Nurserymen**
Scholarship of \$1,000 annually to a student in Tropical Horticulture. It will be designated as \$500 per semester. Full-time student at UHH, declared major in Tropical Horticulture with a GPA of 2.5 or above. Apply on-line at www.hawaiiplants.com
- **Big Island Sustainable Communities Association Scholarship**
\$1,000 scholarship awarded annually to assist upper-division Agriculture students at UH Hilo or HawCC who have demonstrated leadership qualities in school and in the community. - **Hilo Orchid Society Scholarship**
A \$500 scholarship is awarded to a deserving College of Agriculture student majoring in a discipline related to the science, hybridization, or production of orchids or other semi-tropical flowering plants.

Applicant must plan to live on the Orchid Island with intent to work in the horticultural field and promote the flower industry. Student must have been a Hawai'i resident for at least one year and be at least a sophomore, full-time student with a high GPA in previous year(s). - **Kamehameha Schools**
Students of Hawaiian ancestry or part-Hawaiian ancestry are encouraged to apply for the Kamehameha Schools and Ke Ali'i Pauahi Foundation Scholarships.
